Whose Son is He?" "The son of David," they replied. 43 He said to them, "How is it then that David, speaking by the Spirit, calls him 'Lord'? For he says, 44 "'The Lord said to my Lord: "Sit at My right hand until I put your enemies under your feet." 45 If then David calls him 'Lord,' how can He be his Son?" 46 No one could say a word in reply, and from that day on no one dared to ask Him any more questions.

TRINITY 18 Matthew 22:34-46 "2(or 3) ESSENTIALS OF L&G" 10.04.15 OSL

INTRODUCTION A Bethany College professor (Rev.Dr.WKessell) was assigned to preach on this text, but the Chaplain said he had time for 1 minute! How can you keep a prof./pastor down to talking for (only) 1min?! What can be said in 1 min? Dr. Bill gave it a go. (<-It was the most memorable sermon/ette by BLC students) Our Lord Jesus summarized the Law in 1min, in 2 Commands.

A. The **Two** Essentials. **(1) Love to God**. This is the **first** essential of perfection, namely, the desire of perfect service. This is to be the main and chief article of our lives. When we cease to live with this aim, we live below our nature; and instead of being able to plead our infirmities, **we stand chargeable with negligence**. He who does not desire perfection cannot plead imperfection, for if he had any goal at all, his goal was to be imperfect and not to love God with **all** his **heart**, **soul**, and **mind**. **(2) Love to man**. This is the **second** essential, but it is not second in importance, for it "is like it," like the first essential. It stands on the same level and is enforced by the same reasons. I am to love my neighbor as I love myself, because God loves him as He loves me. I am to love him for God's sake, if not for his own.

(If you get the 2nd minute) What more can be said in another minute? 1st, we can say and (all) must admit we have not followed those (2) Commands. We have fallen way short. But, "Wait 1 minute"...There is a solution: G = S.O.S. Jesus, who IS the Gospel is talked about in the second half of our Gospel lesson.

(As we reviewed earlier,) L&G are **both** S.O.S's (L = **Sin** & G = **Saviour**). Dr. Bill (and we can) summarize those in **1 or 2 min**'s. I'm asking for **3 minutes**.

B. The Third Essential. It might have been expected that the holy Gospel would have ended with "on these two commandments depend all the law and the prophets." The Church has thought otherwise and has added faith in Christ in His humanity as the son of David and in His divinity as David's Lord. This does not mean that this is a third essential and that man has three. Faith in Christ is the one power that makes man able to do his two natural duties. We may say: (1) Faith in Christ has made the love of God easy, because to see God in Christ is to love Him. By the sacrifice of Himself, Christ has also removed the barrier of guilt which caused God to be an object of dread. Fear casts out love, but Christ has cast out fear. (2) Faith in Christ makes it easier to love our fellow man. Christ has taught us to love men as He loved them, and for His sake. If, then, faith in Christ is a third essential of duty, it is that which makes "easy" (or possible) the other two great duties. The love of God and man is made possible for all who believe in Christ, who is God and man in one.

Mariah Sawyer is Basic Christian doctrine. On **November 1**st Mariah will be confirmed in the faith she received at her Baptism. Now, while it's *great* to know these Christian Doctrines (by heart). But, they must **sink deeper** (into the **heart** and **soul**). That is the key (the 3rd minute). We can and all should review all Christian doctrines regularly (head) but take it to heart = **faith!**



Christian Questions with Their Answers

Prepared by Dr. Martin Luther for those who intend to go to the Sacrament

1. Do you believe that you are a sinner?

- Yes, I believe it. I am a sinner.
- 2. How do you know this? From the Ten Commandments, which I have not kept.
- 3. Are you sorry for your sins?
- Yes, I am sorry that I have sinned against God.
- 4. What have you deserved from God because of your sins?
 - His wrath and displeasure, temporal death, and eternal damnation. See Romans 6:21, 23.
- 5. Do you hope to be saved?

Yes, that is my hope. In my dear Lord Jesus Christ.

6. In Whom then do you trust?

- The Son of God, True God and true man.

7. Who is Christ?8. How many Gods are there?

- There is only One God, but there are Three Persons: Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

 9. What has Christ done for you that you trust in Him?
 - He died for me and shed His Blood for me on the Cross for the forgiveness of my sins.
- 10. Did the Father also die for you?
 - He did not. The Father is God only, as is the Holy Spirit; but the Son is both True God and true man. He died for me and shed His Blood for me.
- 11. How do you know this?
 - From the holy Gospel, from the Words instituting the Sacrament, and by His Body and Blood given me as a pledge in the Sacrament.
- 12. What are the Words of Institution?
 - Our Lord Jesus Christ, on the night when He was betrayed, took bread, and when He had given thanks, He broke it and gave it to the disciples and said: "Take eat; this is My Body, which is given for you. This do in remembrance of Me." + In the same way also He took the cup after supper, and when He had given thanks, He gave it to them, saying: "Drink of it, all of you; this cup is the New Testament in My Blood, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. Do this as often as you drink It, in remembrance of Me."
- 13. Do you believe then that the true Body and Blood of Christ are in the Sacrament? Yes, I believe it.
- 14. What convinces you to believe this?
 - The Word of Christ: Take, eat, this is My Body; drink of It, all of you, this is My Blood.
- 15. What should we do when we eat His Body and drink His Blood, and in this way receive His pledge?

 We should remember and proclaim His death and the shedding of His Blood, as He taught us: This do, as often as you drink It. in remembrance of Me.
- 16. Why should we remember and proclaim His death?
 - First, so that we may learn to believe that no creature could make satisfaction for our sins. Only Christ, true God and man, could do that. Second, so we may learn to be horrified by our sins, and to regard them as very serious. Third, so we may find joy and comfort in Christ alone, and through faith in Him be saved.
- 17. What motivated Christ to die and make full payment for your sins?
 - His great love for His Father and for me and other sinners, as it is written in **John 14**; **Romans 5**; **Galatians 2**; and **Ephesians 5**.
- 18. Finally, why do you wish to go to the Sacrament?
 - That I may learn to believe that Christ, out of great love, died for my sin, and also learn from Him to love God and my neighbor.
- **19.** What should admonish and encourage a Christian to receive the Sacrament frequently? First, both the command and the promise of Christ the Lord. Second, his own pressing need, because of which the command, encouragement, and promise are given.
- 20. But what should you do if you are not aware of this need and have no hunger and thirst for the Sacrament?

To such a person no better advice can be given than this: first, he should touch his body to see if he still has flesh and blood. Then he should believe what the Scriptures say of it in **Galatians 5** and **Romans 7**. Second, he should look around to see whether he is still in the world, and remember that there will be no lack of sin and trouble, as the Scriptures say in **John 15-16** and in **1 John 2** and **5**. Third, he will certainly have the devil also around him, who with his lying and murdering day and night will let him have no peace, within or without, as the Scriptures picture him in **John 8 and 16**; **1 Peter 5**; **Ephesians 6**; and **2 Timothy 2**.
