ADVENT-4C John 1:19-28 "GOD PREPARES 4 CHRISTMAS W/ JB" 12.20.15 OSL

In the Name of the One to Whom John was faithful. Dear Fellow-Redeemed:

INTRODUCTION Christmas is for kids, so people like to say. We have or had high hopes for our children. Years ago, an Angel visited a couple both of whom were past child-bearing age and told Zacharias: Do not be afraid, Zacharias, for your prayer is heard; and your wife Elizabeth will bear you a son, and you shall call his name John. In Luke 1 we read that Zechariah had high hopes for his son. He might have hoped he would become a great leader or hero. But his child would be a servant. That doesn't seem like much to look forward to, not much for which a father to be proud. And yet, his son, John who baptized is part of the reason why we are here. For billions of Christians, he is a major part of Christmas. THEME:

GOD PREPARED FOR CHRISTMAS SENDING A SERVANT.

John was faithful in his confession and in his work. In his witness, John was a most faithful servant. A good servant, he claimed no credit for himself. He resisted glory. He was not like a (Republican *or* Democrat) **politician eager for every television interview or the Kardashians**.

Everyone has pride. John was no different. We like to think we are special, important. We may envy the famous. Few have the chance for fame. Few are known far and wide. John could have had glory. Our Bible section opens with these words, verse 19: Now this is the testimony of John, when the Jews sent priests and Levites from Jerusalem to ask him, "Who are you?" He was becoming famous. Jewish leaders sent an investigating team. People were hearing about him. Here is a temptation. People try all kinds of outrageous deeds to get noticed. They want to go viral. People kill to make the news ...(sadly) literally.

John could have gone for glory. The scene was set. We read, As the people were in expectation, and all were questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Christ. (Luke 3:15) Many followed him. But when He was interrogated by the priests: "Who are you?" He confessed, and did not deny, but confessed, "I am not the Christ." And they asked him, "Who then? Are you Elijah?" He said, "I am not." "Are you the Prophet?" And he answered, "No."

He was **God's servant**. **He was a man of humility**. He saw his glory only in light of the greater glory of the One Whose way He was preparing. He confessed for all to hear: The One who is mightier than I is coming. I'm not good enough to untie his shoe straps. Now John was clothed with camel's hair and with a leather belt around his waist, and he ate locusts and wild honey.

The sin of pride tugged at his heart as ours but like us, he celebrated the birth of the One Mightier. With John, we must give our pride to Jesus in confession. We are servants. God is God.

God gave John courage to confess this truth. It took courage. It wasn't quite the same but similar to little Christian children under ISIS being told to renounce Jesus. It was something few of us have suffered. We have not been investigated by the higher authorities concerning our faith. But friends, neighbors, some-times even relatives put us on the spot about our faith. It takes courage to answer, "Who are you? Are you a Christian?"

John relied on the One greater. God's servant confessed: I am "The voice of one crying in the wilderness: Make straight the way of the Lord." God did send him to do something big, make the way ready for Jesus. John told the truth. John attacked pride and self-righteousness in others, even the powerful leaders of the church of his day. But when he saw many of the Pharisees and Sadducees coming to his Baptism, he said to them, "Brood of vipers! Who has warned you to flee from the wrath to come? Therefore bear fruits worthy of repentance and do not think to say to yourselves, 'We have Abraham as our father.' For I say to you that God is able to raise up children of Abraham from these stones. And even now the ax is laid to the root of the trees. Therefore every tree which does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire."

Nowadays, Christians don't like their preachers condemning other preachers. We misunderstand Jesus' command: *Judge not, lest ye be Judged*. God sent John to prepare souls for Jesus. **John judged**. He called all, the great and the not so great to repentance, to give their sins to Jesus. Only by repentance are we ready for Christmas.

He is ranked with other courageous preachers who told the bold truth even when others didn't want to hear it. **John's "reward" - he lost his head.** The courage to boldly preach God's word got him dead like others who came after and boldly preach God's word: **Stephen, Peter, Jan Hus.** He served God. Jesus said, "And do not fear those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul. But rather fear Him who is able to destroy both soul and body in hell." It is **not** for **John's** sake or for **Luther's** sake. It is **for JESUS' sake we do not have to fear** the only Being who is able to destroy both soul and body in hell. God forgives us. God takes care of us. He took care of our biggest problem by sending His only-begotten Son Jesus. This is what we celebrate at Christmas.

John was a faithful servant in his work. He did what God sent him to do. A servant, John exercised God's authority. The authorities are under attack today. And they are sinners. They do bad things. But those with God's authority are to be heeded, to be obeyed. Authorities are to be respected especially those who serve God. John represented the Holy God. God gave him the authority to point people to Jesus. When asked why he baptized John answered them, saying, "I baptize with water, but there stands One among you whom you do not know. It is He who, coming after me, is preferred before me, whose sandal strap I am not worthy to loose. I baptize you with water, but He will Baptize you with the Holy Spirit."

John and all faithful ministers prepare us for the coming of Jesus. They do this in a God appointed way. John and all faithful ministers call us to

the water of Baptism. In repentance, God would drown our sins, our old nature in the water that regenerates us in Jesus. Jesus said this about repentance. Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick God calls us to repent so we will recognize we are sick. We need a divine physician. If we think nothing is wrong, we will think we do not need the help from the One sent on Christ as Savior. And John explained repentance. It is more than words. True repentance includes the **God-given desire to change**. People who came to John asked: What should we do? John told the **greedy**, "He who has two tunics, let him give to him who has none; and he who has food, let him do likewise." To **businessmen** he said, "Collect no more than what is appointed to you." To **soldiers**, "Do not intimidate accuse falsely, and be content with your wages." Repentance includes the desire to turn from sin.

True repentance doesn't end here. Once we know who we are under God's law, God points us to Jesus and all He has done for us. When John saw Jesus for the first time: He said, "Behold! The Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world!" Know what that means. If you drink too much, Jesus, the Lamb of God took away your sin. If you are full of hate, Jesus, the Lamb took hate. If you are an adulterer, greedy, a thief, or murderer, Jesus is the Lamb of God who took away all our sin.

John is most famous as being the Baptizer. He, even, reluctantly baptized Jesus saying: "I need to be baptized by You and are You coming to me?" But Jesus answered and said to him, "Let it to be so now, because it is fitting for us to fulfill all righteousness." During the Baptism, John had a vision. And John bore witness, saying, "I saw the Spirit descending from Heaven like a Dove and He remained upon Him. I did not know Him, but He who sent me to Baptize with water said to me, 'The One on Whom you see the Spirit descending and remaining on Him, this is He Who Baptizes with the Holy Spirit.' And I have seen and testified that this is the Son of God."

On Christmas we celebrate the Birth of God in human Flesh. God in human flesh came to take away our sin. What could it mean that God's perfect Son got down into the water of Baptism? While we know that no simple water could cleanse our conscience or wash away our sins, we also know that Jesus was sent to be our righteousness. He was sent to be our holiness. He took our sins away. He also got down into the water of Baptism. He had no sin to be washed away. Because He went into the water of Baptism, He empowers Baptism. He did what God commanded us to do. He did it for us all. He makes us holy in spite of ourselves.

CONCLUSION John pointed us to Jesus because **Jesus is Life**. He took John's sin. He gave him holiness. He took our sin. He gave us His holiness. Jesus calls us all to serve in humble repentance and faith.

People ask: *Are you ready for Christmas(?)*. We have been to the font of Baptism. We have been washed, sanctified, justified in Jesus and by God's Spirit. We **are** ready for Christmas. *IJ'N*, **Amen.** *SDG*
